CITY OF MERIDIAN SEEKS TO FILL TWO COMMISSION VACANCIES: ARTS AND TRANSPORTATION

MERIDIAN – The City of Meridian is looking for Meridian residents who are interested in volunteer positions and would like to serve on the Meridian Arts Commission or the Transportation Commission.

Arts Commission

The Meridian Arts Commission advises the Mayor and the Meridian City Council on arts and cultural policies and promotes public awareness and participation in the arts. The person who fills this vacancy will serve a 3 year term through January 31, 2018. Meetings are held at 3:30 p.m. on the second Thursday of each month at Meridian City Hall.

Transportation Commission

This Commission is a forum for transportation planning and project development, including the advancement of a safe, efficient and multi-modal transportation network relating to roads, transit corridors, bike lanes, sidewalks, pathways and lighting. The person is being appointed to serve out the remainder of a 3 year term that ends on May 31, 2017 . Meetings are held at 3:30 p.m. on the first Monday of each month at Meridian City Hall.

Bicycling is an important part of Meridian’s transportation needs for commuters and recreational users alike. In order to broaden the makeup of the Commission, candidates who have a strong interest in bicycle related issues are encouraged to apply.
