MERIDIAN CITY HALL SITE PARTICIPATES IN NEW AND EXPANDED SERVICES BY MERIDIAN LIBRARY DISTRICT

Meridian, ID – (September 2, 2014) – To celebrate the start of a brand new school year, the Meridian Library District is updating its outreach schedule and location offerings, and the City of Meridian is joining in the effort.

Starting September 10, the new Library Bookmobile schedule will include more weekly stops at elementary schools, visits to local middle and high schools, as well as a brand new stop at the Meridian City Hall where residents will have yet another location to get a library card, check out books and DVDs.

The City Hall stop will take place every Wednesday from 2 - 4 p.m. As an added convenience, library patrons will be able to designate this as their location to pick up holds by selecting Meridian Library District Sprinter from the library website at www.mld.org.

September is Library Card Sign-Up Month. The Library gives students access to resources, one-on-one training and guidance in using information and digital tools.

Last year, the Meridian Library District provided more than 1,000 programs for Meridian residents of all ages. This June and July, the three Meridian Library locations circulated more than 200,000 items to library users, and offer access to more than 1 million items, including digital and non-digital resources.
