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
City of Meridian Seeks to Fill Planning and Zoning Commission Vacancies

MERIDIAN –City of Meridian officials are looking to fill two vacancies on the Planning and Zoning Commission. This five-person commission serves an advisory role to the Meridian City Council in matters relating to land use, zoning, transportation, and housing issues as framed by Meridian’s Comprehensive Plan.

Applicants for the current openings must be City of Meridian residents or reside in the city’s area of impact. Applicants will need to provide proof of residency in Ada County for two years and within the area of impact or Meridian for at least one year. Meridian’s area of impact is identified as the unincorporated area in white on the attached map (second page), within the dotted lines.

Commissioners are required to remain a resident in the area during their six year term of service. The Planning and Zoning Commission meets the first and third Thursday of every month at 6:00 pm at Meridian City Hall. Members are appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by a majority vote of the City Council.

Anyone who meets the established criteria and would like to be considered for the voluntary positions should send a letter of interest and resume to Mayor Tammy de Weerd at Meridian City Hall (33 E. Broadway Avenue, Suite 300, Meridian, ID 83642) by Friday, December 19, 2014.
