## **Public Meeting Scheduled for Future West Meridian 47-Acre Regional Park**

MERIDIAN – The City of Meridian Parks and Recreation Department is hosting a public meeting one week from today on Thursday, July 30, 2015 from 6:30 – 8 p.m. at Meridian City Hall, to discuss land near Cherry Lane and McDermott Road that will be developed into a 47-acre regional park.

The department wants to get the community's input regarding a vision for the future park that includes a variety of features, from sports fields to pathways, picnic shelters, a playground, an off-leash dog area, and more.

“Our parks are one of the area's amenities that Meridian residents deeply value, so it's very important to us to involve the community in our future planning efforts,” said Steve Siddoway, Meridian Parks and Recreation Director. “We hope to see many residents at this public meeting and to gather as much input as possible.”

Attendees will have the opportunity to view proposed conceptual designs for the park, as well as ask questions, provide suggestions and offer feedback. Light refreshments will also be available.
